



# Telecommunications (Schedule 3) Works Agreement

(for low-impact works under the *Telecommunications Act 1997* (Cwth) and *Transport Infrastructure Act 1994*)

This Works Agreement (and all attachments including the Standard Conditions and Works Proposal) constitutes an agreement under s.11, Schedule 3, *Telecommunications Act* (Cwth) for the inspection, maintenance and/or installation of facilities under Schedule 3, Division 4, *Telecommunications Act* (Cwth) and a notice of the Chief Executive's requirements under s.80, *Transport Infrastructure Act* for the installation or maintenance of facilities within a state-controlled road. The carrier in the Works Agreement is named as the 'Utility'.

### Important information:

- This agreement is issued based on the information provided by, or on behalf of the utility. If the information provided is not accurate in a significant sense, that is grounds for TMR to terminate the agreement.
- During any activity on site a copy of this Works Agreement must be produced upon request by a TMR officer.
- The utility is responsible for ensuring that any third-party consultant or contractor representing the utility complies with the requirements of the Works Agreement.
- Failure to follow plans and unauthorised works will result in the utility being required to rectify assets to meet design specifications at the cost of the utility. If works are not rectified, they will not be lawfully located in the state-controlled road. Future relocation of assets, or maintenance resulting from the installation, to facilitate road works will be undertaken at the utility's cost.
- The utility is required to notify TMR of works undertaken in an emergency. If the emergency works will impact the road or pedestrian safety, the utility is required to call the TMR's Traffic Management Centre on 1800 13 19 40 or 13 19 40.
- The utility is required to notify TMR in writing as soon as practical after the emergency works have occurred on the TMR's road. Notification after the emergency will ensure that TMR can assess the works and issue a notice for the utility to make safe or compliant with applicable standards if required.
