

Exemption from Wearing a Seatbelt Certificate



Transport Operations (Road Use Management—Road Rules) Regulation 2009

The purpose of this certificate is to allow a doctor to certify that the person named in the certificate should not wear a seatbelt because of the person's medical condition.

This medical condition assessment should be conducted in accordance with the national medical standards (Commercial and Private Vehicle Drivers) *Assessing Fitness to Drive 2003*.

Important information

- The exemption from wearing a seatbelt may *ONLY* apply for a period of not more than 12 months from the date of the issue of the certificate.
- The completed certificate is not required to be returned to the Department of Transport and Main Roads.
- This certificate must be carried by the *driver* if the person mentioned in the certificate is the driver of a vehicle fitted with a seatbelt.
- This certificate must be carried by the *driver* if the person mentioned in the certificate is a passenger in a vehicle fitted with a seatbelt.
- The certificate must be produced immediately to a police officer by the *driver* if the police officer asks for it.
