How to complete this form

- A traffic control device is any sign, signal, pavement marking, or other installation placed or erected under authority of the TORUM, for the purpose of regulating, warning or guiding road users.
When detailing your grounds for this challenge under Section A - Traffic Control Device or Sign, please consider:
- It is a legislative requirement under the TORUM that you clearly set out the grounds of the challenge, for example 'View of traffic control sign was obstructed by [object] on [x] Street' or 'A Variable Speed Limit (VSL) sign was not operational or was displaying a different speed limit on [x] Street'.

If you are completing Section B – Camera Detected Offences:

- The term 'accuracy' as it relates to a photographic detection device may include how the device identifies your vehicle as the target vehicle; how the data shown on the image relates to the alleged vehicle or how the device measures and records the speed of a target vehicle.
