



Consular Corp Number Plates – Issue/ Replace/Remake Application

Transport Operations (Road Use Management) Act 1995 (TORUM)

Conditions of Use

Consular Corp (CC) number plates are issued by the Queensland Government as a courtesy to Foreign Consuls.

1. Number Plate Entitlements

Consular Post

- are entitled to one set of CC plates issued in the name of the Consulate for every two Career Consuls employed in the Consulate Post.

Career Consuls

- are entitled to one set of CC plates for a motor vehicle registered solely in the name of the Career Consul
- a second set of CC plates may be issued in the name of the Career Consul, for another vehicle jointly registered if the Career Consul is accompanied by a spouse. No more than two vehicles with CC plates are to be registered to the customer.

Honorary Consuls

- are entitled to only one set of CC plates at any one time for a vehicle which must be registered in the name of the Honorary Consul (or jointly with spouse)
- are not entitled to a second set of CC plates for their spouse.

2. Payment

- is required at the time of application.

3. Rules

- The applicant must produce suitable EOI when the application is lodged. (For requirements, refer to the separate *Evidence of Identity Requirements for Individuals Information Sheet (S5385)* or *Evidence of Identity Requirements for Organisations Information Sheet (S5386)*, or tmr.qld.gov.au).
- The applicant must also produce their current photo identification card issued by the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade.
- The applicant must have an *Application for CC Plates* issued and stamped by the Department of Premier and Cabinet office. It is the customer's responsibility to make application for this approval.
- The applicant must have approval from the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade if purchasing a new or imported vehicle and attaching CC plates.
- Only the consular employees listed above are entitled to CC plates.
- Consular plates cannot be registered in the name of a company, business or trust.
- Consular plates cannot be attached to vehicles registered in the name of a company, business or trust.
- The display of CC plates does not entitle the driver of the vehicle to any immunity in respect of the traffic laws of the state and they may be issued an infringement notice if those laws are breached.
- The vehicle must comply with the *Transport Operations (Road Use Management–Vehicle Standards and Safety) Regulation 2010*.
- The vehicle cannot be left hand drive.
- The vehicle cannot be transferred with CC plates attached.
- CC plates will be issued as a pair, an accessory plate is available at an extra cost to the applicant.
- Personalised/customised number plates are not permitted to be attached to a vehicle with a CC concession recorded against it.
- If the applicant is no longer entitled to a CC concession or are returning to their home country, the Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR) must be advised. The CC plates must be surrendered to TMR and cancelled within 14 days.

4. Please ensure–

- The applicant/s must produce acceptable Evidence of Identity (EOI) when the application is lodged. (For requirements, refer to the separate *Evidence of Identity Requirements for Individuals Information Sheet (S5385)* or *Evidence of Identity Requirements for Organisations Information Sheet (S5386)*, or tmr.qld.gov.au).
- a completed and stamped *Application for CC Plates* from the Department of Premier and Cabinet is included with this application.
- The applicant/s must have approval from the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade if purchasing a new or imported vehicle and attaching CC plates.
